The **Mind Research Network** has received a \$25,000 gift for the Domenici Discovery Fund from **Los Alamos National Security LLC (LANS)**.

LANS manages and operates **Los Alamos National Laboratory** for the **National Nuclear Security Administration**. LANL worked with former U.S. Sen. Pete Domenici to found the Mind Research Network 11 years ago in Albuquerque.

The Network is a neurodiagnostic center with collaborators across the country, including Harvard and Yale universities, the universities of Minnesota and New Mexico and others. It focuses on schizophrenia, autism, bipolar disorder, epilepsy, alcoholism, addiction and traumatic brain injury.

The **Mind Research Network** uses advanced neuroimaging and genetic tools to identify brain disorders at an early stage and find better ways to diagnose and treat them.

Scientists in the Network rely on research grants that require matching dollars. The Domenici Discovery Fund generates that money through corporate and individual donations.
